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

Our Trip Notes

#1. El Farallon in Cabo San Lucas is an unforgettable oceanfront experience for seafood specialties. Tucked into the cliffs and stocked daily with bounty from local fisherman, El Farallon overlooks the Pacific Ocean with unparalleled views. The local catch rests on mounds of shaved ice and invites patrons to use their old-fashioned scale that weighs each fresh selection of the day.

#2. Manta's Chef Enrique Olvera, inspired by the views, conceived Manta with an intriguing double meaning: The manta ray symbolizes the kitchen's focus on seafood, while manta, the Spanish word for blanket, conveys the chef's emphasis on comfort. Olvera celebrates Pacific coasts traditions—taking inspiration from his native Mexico, as well as Peru, Japan and beyond—while maintaining a distinct and tastefully casual Baja sensibility with a commitment to sourcing local ingredients from Baja California Sur.

#3. The Toro Latin Kitchen & Bar concept comes from acclaimed chef and restaurateur Richard Sandoval, recognized as the "Father of modern Mexican cuisine". At Toro, he masterfully blends Pan Latin with South American, Japanese and Chinese influences. The name Toro, meaning "bull" in Spanish and "tuna belly" in Japanese, sets the stage for specialties seasoned with Pan Asian flare and Baja freshness.

#4. Flora Farms is a place so magical, Maroon 5's Adam Levine got married in the culinary oasis. In the desert hills above Puerto Los Cabos, sits this organic farm and gardens with its brick ovens, covered patios and event spaces. Their gourmet creations start before dawn with fresh breads and pastries; and continue throughout the day with homegrown ingredients.

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Object of desire

Place your bets

Geoffrey Parker, known around the world for its incredibly chic, hand-crafted board games and games tables, sets the bar even higher than usual with perhaps its most incredible creation to date: the Exceptional Poker Set. Exceptional, indeed. Featuring more than 22,500 precious stones, approximately 25lb of 18K gold, and exotic skins, this set takes more than six months for the third-generation family company to build and is available through the newly-launched Avarice Marketplace.

The hand-bound alligator case (in your color of choice, naturally), has two solid 18K gold combination locks. Inside, you'll find double-sided poker chips, also made from solid 18K gold, inlaid with shagreen and Dauphin calf leather embossed with your choice of denomination and value, with the option to personalize one side. The different colored chips have precious stones set around the outside (purple with white diamonds, blue with sapphires, green with emeralds, red with rubies and black with black diamonds) and are neatly nestled in the suede-lined case. There's also a handsome solid gold dealer button and three blind buttons. As to the cards? The set is complete with four decks of gold-plated playing cards in alligator card lifts. IN THE ZONE

You probably have a dual-time watch, and you might have a worldtimer — what else do you need to track time around the globe? If you're a frequent traveler to India, Australia or even some parts of Canada, whose time zones are offset by 30 or 45 minutes instead of one hour, you're missing the ability to see that exact time at a glance. Recently, two independent watchmakers showed pieces featuring independent time zones, elegantly solving this problem. While it's not a new complication, it is not found in many brands' collections. These watches have independent gear trains, sometimes even independent barrels, essentially putting two movements with the same winding system inside one watch, allowing you to change minutes, not just hours. If it's 1am in New York and 10:30am in India, it's easily visible. Even if you don't regularly use these offset time zones, you might find a reason to pick one up — a watchmaker told us that a client used one time zone as his perennially late partner's personal time zone.

Arnold & Son's design codes, including its dedication to symmetry and impeccable finishing, as well as its skill at skeletonized movements, are on brilliant display in the manual-wind DBG Skeleton. There are two dials of smoky sapphire crystal, each showing a different time zone. The left uses Roman numerals, has open hands and is set with the crown at 9 o'clock, while the right uses Arabic numerals, has closed hands and is set with the crown at 3 o'clock, making the watch very clear to read and easy to set, with no risk of accidentally setting the wrong time zone. At 12 o'clock you'll find a 24-hour dial with an open hand and a closed hand, which can be used to calculate the difference between the time zones, as well as serving as a day/night indicator. There's also an elegant seconds hand shared by both time zones, because thankfully seconds don't vary around the world. This complicated movement was designed and manufactured in-house at its base in La Chaux-de-Fonds and is the first time Arnold & Son has used this complication in its modern era. In addition to being very useful, the movement is absolutely beautiful. The dials, gears and balances form a harmonious composition, and the exceptional finishing includes chamfered bridges with polished edges, satin-finished wheels and Côtes de Genève stripes.

Having a similar function is just about the only similarity between the two watches pictured here. Manufacture Royale, known for pushing the envelope with its avant-garde timepieces, takes a different approach to independent time zones with its automatic 1770 Haute Voltige. The main time display is more traditional with large hands, and the second time zone is displayed on a quilted guilloché subdial at 5 o'clock. Both time zones are set through the crown at 3 o'clock. The black sunray guilloché main dial provides a dramatic background to the architectural movement, where sculpted bridges support a raised balance wheel and counter, dominating the display.

Romain Gauthier's First Automatic Watch

Today, thinness seems to be king. Everywhere from watches to smartphones, becoming thinner and thinner is an eternal quest, and often brands are forced to sacrifice one of the most essential components to achieve this: power. And without power, both are just pretty objects.

In horology, the number of hours of available power reserve and how the watch is wound are of crucial importance. Some people love the feeling of winding their own watches, and others dislike the task and would much prefer a self-winding timepiece. With a short power reserve, you're constantly resetting the time or traveling with a watch winder. While Romain Gauthier has always searched for and created the most efficient winding systems possible — see his brilliant Logical One with a winding pusher integrated into the caseband and Prestige HMS Ten with a flat crown on the caseback — until now his collection did not have an automatic timepiece. In the new, beautifully finished Insight Micro-Rotor, a 22K solid gold

bidirectional micro-rotor is visible dial-side and provides up to 80 hours of power reserve, meaning you can take it off on Friday night and put it back on Monday morning without having to set the time. Available in several metal and dial combinations, our favorite is the platinum case with vivid blue enamel dial. All versions boast

BRAND PROFILE PARMIGIANI FLEURIER

One of the younger brands in high watchmaking, Parmigiani Fleurier was founded in 1996 by Michel Parmigiani and the Sandoz Family Foundation. Evolving from a small company focusing on table clocks and unique pieces into a vertically-integrated manufacturer that designs, creates and manufactures 99 percent of every single component of its 33 movements in-house, it has become a favorite of discerning collectors for its sometimes unusual complications and its distinctive style. 1. Ovale Tourbillon Abyss Blue

Its oval shape, unusual in watchmaking, houses the first watch in the world to have a tourbillon with a central second hand, which requires much more power. The hypnotic dial is in a proprietary Abyss Blue color and is decorated with Côtes de Genève. The watch boasts a seven-day power reserve and is limited to 50 pieces. **\$195,000**

2. Tonda 1950 Lune

This sleek steel watch features a black opaline dial with black alligator strap, providing a vivid contrast to the moonphase dial at 12 o'clock. It shows the moon cycle in both hemispheres with rose discs representing the lunar cycle. It's extremely accurate — the scale is calibrated for the lunar month and it only needs to be corrected once every three years. At 6 o'clock, a seconds subdial with date aperture balances the watch. **\$12,900**

3. Toric

The first watch Parmigiani designed for his brand was the Toric Memory Time, and he's continued to expand on the iconic case - which takes inspiration from the golden spiral and Doric columns — in some of his most complicated timepieces. The knurled bezel is distinctive and is created by a single craftsman, as it is an uncommon and difficult skill. This is the first chronometer in the Toric collection, it is COSC-certified and has a 55-hour power reserve. \$18,500

FIRST DRIVE: MASERATI GRANTURISMO CONVERTIBLE 2018

There are certain inevitabilities that we all face in life, and few, in my opinion, cause more internal suffering and conflict than the gradual realization that the trusty sports car is no longer practical and it is time to get a bigger, more sensible car. It's goodbye to your beloved two-seat soft-top and welcome to a large, practical and criminally vanilla station wagon. That is until now.

Dear reader, I'm pleased to report we may finally have a solution. Space without losing the speed; practicality with no loss of panache. Say hello to the new Maserati GranTurismo Convertible 2018.

At 193.7 inches, it is only an inch smaller than the ultimate family wagon, the Volvo V90. It has plenty of space in the trunk and its rear seats provide ample room for any adult to sit in, let alone children. Yet, this effortlessly classy car is armed with a beast of a 4,691cc V8 engine, capable of reaching 62mph in 4.9 seconds from a standing start. There is enough carbon fiber and aerodynamic engineering throughout for it to feel like a sports car, with typical Italian attention to design detail everywhere.

Of course, however much you dress it up, the Maserati GranTurismo is not the super racing car some would wish it to be. The downside of all that extra practical space is that it can feel somewhat heavy around the corners. The sport mode option entices you to throw the car around a little more, but despite the wonderful roar of the engine beneath you, it is a battle and a constant reminder that your two-seater has gone forever, despite your best attempts to replicate it aesthetically. That is, however, an unfair expectation from a car of this size: you wouldn't take your finest dressage horse and expect him to compete on the polo field, but the GranTurismo competes as close as possible to any sportier model.

Instead of dwelling on what the car doesn't do and pretending it is something it's not, it's better to enjoy what the Maserati does bring. Forget about sport mode, and enjoy the effortless class the car characterizes, and the head-turning, child-waving, famous Maserati roar of the engine.

Gone are the days of the 60-second burst on the hood, this is a car to go long distances with an endless supply of obliging power on tap. Perhaps being sensible doesn't have to be boring after all. **From \$132,000, maserati.com**

The Classic – The Bugatti 57SC Atlantic

We are lucky enough to live in a world which contains some truly magnificent cars. From classics to modern supercars, the caliber of automobiles right across the manufacturing spectrum deserves more recognition than it currently receives, particularly from non-enthusiasts. Occasionally, however, a car can be elevated beyond the comparison to just other automobiles. It becomes something to be compared to a classical masterpiece or a great medical breakthrough. The Bugatti Type 57SC Atlantic is just that, which is why there was little surprise when it recently won the Concorso d'Eleganza Villa d'Este, the world's most prestigious car show that takes place on the shores of Lake Como.

Considered by many as a monument to pre-war Europe, the Atlantic 57SC was the pinnacle of the Bugatti's family's contribution to the 20th century and the automotive industry.

Your chances of ever getting to drive this car are almost zilch, as there are only two in the world. One, from 1936, recently sold for \$40m and is now in residence at the Mullin Automotive Museum in California, and a second, from 1938, belongs to Ralph Lauren. But you do not need to drive it to appreciate it.

THERE IS NO SECOND PLACE

The 35th America's Cup Match presented by Louis Vuitton is over, and so is the Cup as we've come to know it in the Larry Ellison era. Emirates Team New Zealand dominated Oracle Team USA, allowing the Kiwis to avenge their astonishing loss in 2013 and to fulfill their promise to bring the Cup home. After two years of criss-crossing the globe in thrilling races, the Cup ended with a bit of a whimper. Emirates Team New Zealand simply outclassed Oracle Team USA, and the nail-biting comeback that everyone in Bermuda was expecting never materialized. Now, we turn to the future. If they already know, they are keeping it quiet for now, and fans wait on tenterhooks to hear if they will have to wait another four years for the Cup to return, and what it will look like when it does.

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

Founded by Ludwig Moser in 1857, Moser Crystal has created exceptional works for discerning clientele ever since, crafting bespoke pieces for heads of state and royal families. This year the brand celebrates 160 years of fine craftsmanship and we visited the anniversary exhibition at Thomas Goode in Mayfair, London. The intricate engravings and delicate glassware show the meticulous technique used — the same technique that has been passed on from generation to generation for the best part of two centuries. The astonishing attention to detail is made all the more impressive when CEO František Schneider tells us that each step of production is done by hand, and it's a skill that can take decades to perfect. That perfectionism means that a great percentage of the works are scrapped if not up to Moser's impeccably high standards.

The collection features works inspired by Moser's most important and celebrated pieces. The whimsical Path to Glory collection features intricate gilded motifs with beautiful minute detail, and the On the Wings of a Dragonfly collection has a floral Art Nouveau style throughout — we adore the Chloe cup, which solves the dilemma of champagne or wine, as this enameled goblet can be used both ways. The collection also features more modern works using Moser's signature color range but still employing the expert craftsmanship.

While the entire collection is met with gasps of awe (and trembling hands as we held the lighter-than-air glasses), the pièce de résistance is the chandelier. The arms are gilded in several layers of 24K gold and adorned with 133 drops from hand-blown and cut crystal in Moser's bespoke golden topaz color. It took 40 people and a year of labor, but seeing how mesmerizingly it catches the light, it's definitely worth it. moser-glass.com

Chris Burch

Chris Burch on making a difference

Lauren Holmes speaks to Chris Burch, CEO of Burch Creative Capital, about his new venture in Indonesia, making a connection with his workforce and giving something back to the communities in which his businesses thrive

It's Saturday night at Nihi Sumba Island, the world-class lodge set on the remote Indonesian island of Sumba, and while guests mingle over barbecued tiger prawns, barracuda sashimi and cacao-flavored negronis, I take the opportunity to do some detective work. I'm in Indonesia to profile billionaire entrepreneur Chris Burch, who co-owns Nihi Sumba Island with hotelier James McBride. Since the pair took over in 2012, the once-simple surf spot has skyrocketed to the accolade of being named best hotel in the world. As the founder and CEO of Burch Creative Capital, Chris Burch is a man with the Midas touch when it comes to business. Perhaps best known as the co-founder of fashion brand Tory Burch (which he launched with his ex-wife), he is the force behind multiple technology and luxury brands, including Jawbone, Poppin, Voss Water and hospitality group the Faena Hotel + Universe. More recently, he partnered with great pal and entertainer Ellen DeGeneres to launch her lifestyle brand ED. So who better to ask about the man behind the headlines than his staff? Far from reluctant, each person lights up when I mention his name, and everyone has a story to tell. "The first time I met Chris, he had me in a headlock by the end of dinner, both of us roaring with laughter," shares Johnny, Nihi Sumba Island's Kiwi boatmaster. "Ask him where he gets his endless, boundless energy from ... "

"I'd like to know how he always, always picks such successful projects to invest in," says London-born Lloyd the landscape gardener. The more I dig, the more it seems Burch is far from a stereotypical billionaire.

Weeks later, I catch him en route to an early breakfast meeting in New York, one of the three American cities along with Miami and LA where he now divides most of his time. "It's the key to my success," he shares, without hesitation, when I touch on his relationship with his staff. "My understanding of people. I have an empathetic nature and I see people differently. One of my best qualities is asking a lot of questions. I figure out where that little kid was at 14, what drives them, what makes them special and I then relate to them in that manner. So say someone is pitching me a company related to space, I figure out who they are, what kind of tenacity, integrity, creativity they have. I connect with them in an emotional way and then I tie that within the marketplace and what I understand of consumers. I see if this human can do a great job."

Burch describes the process as a "camera of curiosity" inside his head, which automatically scans everyone who crosses his path. It's a skill that he credits to a childhood of poor school grades, an inability to concentrate and trouble sleeping. He would stay up through the night, listening to sleepless callers on the talk radio show *Voices Of America* in the broom closet. "I'd spend my time just listening to people think and talk, and it helped to form my brain to be very curious and to listen, to create ideas and dreams from these conversations." really realize that I had any talent, but was fortunately very successful because I came up with good ideas. It wasn't until I got older that I became more reflective on who I am and who others are. That kind of metamorphosis comes a lot from being hurt by other people, from when you are wrong, and the pain of disappointment, as well as from the joy when people surprise you. So hopefully the older I get, the better I get at having a clear understanding about why we as people do what we do."

A regular guest speaker at Harvard Business School, Burch stands out as an entrepreneur who credits his success to empathy above all else. While Burch's business career has the markings of a Wall Street fairy tale, the path was not always paved with gold. Things hit a rough patch in 2006 when he split from his wife and business partner Tory Burch, a period that he credits as one of the most transformative in his life. "I've had big moments of pain that have actually defined me and big moments of joy that have defined me. I went through a period when I was paralyzed, very ill and going through a divorce. It felt as if

Burch took his first foray into business at Ithaca College, selling varsity-style sweaters to classmates with the help of his brother and a \$2,000 investment. The company, Eagle Eye, was eventually sold to Swire Group for \$165 million, which gave Burch the means to invest in Internet Capital Group, a well-known IPO story from the early days of the internet revolution. "Early on, I just went with gut instinct and creativity," he says. "I didn't everything was falling apart around me. I came out of that learning so much about good and bad, about people and life, about tenacity and about picking yourself up. I think these hard times actually take away a little of your soul and then build a little. The most defining moments of my business career are when I figured out that I was capable of a deeper creative understanding of people. I am very lucky that I'm not built with envy of others. In fact, that's one of my greatest pleasures, other people's success around me."

If a single trait runs through Burch's business investments, it's a passion for disruption, for going against the grain and backing products or people who challenge the status quo. Testament to this, his latest ventures include luxury pre-fab housing company Cocoon9 and the hospitality supplier Bur+Mah, which enables designers to custom-create fittings and finishings.

"I get very excited about bringing new concepts or products to the world in a different manner, especially when they haven't been introduced in the US. Last week, I was in China and found some of the most beautiful quality products, from furniture to stones and pots, all of which were very inexpensive. Whatever I do, I want to bring a spirit of uniqueness that calms the human soul."

If that is Burch's defining aim, then with Nihi Sumba Island he has painted nothing short of a masterpiece. Burch first visited the island in Sumba on the behest of some of his surfing buddies and was captivated by the raw natural beauty, its remoteness and the charm of its people. Back then, Nihi Sumba Island was "four or five simple shacks run by a group who didn't have the capital to put into it. After we bought it, we realized that we were sitting on a jewel. It would be like thinking you have a nice coal mine, and ending up finding diamonds. And the reason we have diamonds is because we have the Sumbanese people. We have the most beautiful land, the water is beautiful and it's a place where you can really relax and be happy, but it's the people that make it so special – don't you just love them?"

Such is Burch's passion for supporting the people that upon purchasing the hotel, he immediately took over half the funding for the Sumba Foundation, Nihi Sumba Island's non-profit organization, originally launched by founder Claude






hospitality industry could do well to watch. "We are expanding now and it feels good. Five of our guests decided to throw a fundraiser for the foundation on their own and they raised \$70,000. Where have you been in the world, where people meet at a hotel, get together as a group of friends and decide to have a party to raise money and change the lives of a lot of people off their own backs? I mean it just blew me away. So beautiful, right?"

Is placing philanthropy at the heart of business an approach Burch feels inspired to include in all his projects? "I would only do it if it was totally real. I'm really not into these companies who use so-called philanthropy as a way to sell more product. I think philanthropy is critical to how you build a business, but it has to really come from the heart, changing the people's lives without interrupting their society. Sumba will be a hard one to match, but every hotel I build we will involve the community. So even if we open a city hotel, I want to offer free nursery to local kids."

As the conversation draws to a close, Chris shares that his happiest moments are spent at Nihi Sumba Island, trekking back from the waterfall and then heading for a massage. "And conversations like this," he says, "the intelligent questions you've asked, the way you have woven this conversation into a story that flows like water, that makes me feel happy, relaxed. Relaxation is not a space but a human." By the time we hang up, I'm grinning from ear-to-ear, shoulders tall, floating in a bubble and I realize I have been completely Chris Burched. He has connected so effortlessly, pin-pointed my passions, that I leave the call wanting to work with him and for him, to help and support this man with a miracle mind for clearly understanding and raising up humanity. "What does success mean to me?" Chris explained, "It's that moment when someone goes 'Ah, wow! He really got me.""

Since then, the foundation has provided healthcare to over 25,000 people and is responsible for reducing the rate of malaria by 85 percent, as well as building 300 wells and watering holes and supporting 16 schools by delivering lunch to otherwise hungry kids.  Dominion Diamond Winds Embrace ring

Today more than ever, consumers are concerned about responsibly sourced jewels and precious metals. They want to buy their jewelry with a clear conscience, knowing the gems and metals were mined both ethically and sustainably



It was back in 2006 that the concept of "blood diamonds" hit us thanks to the release of the film Blood Diamond starring Leonardo DiCaprio. Also referred to as conflict diamonds (to highlight the negative consequences of the diamond trade), these are gems mined in a war zone and typically sold to finance army efforts. Six years earlier, in 2000, when southern African diamondproducing states met in Kimberley, South Africa, they discussed ways to stop trade of conflict diamonds and ensure that diamond purchases did not finance violence or rebel movements. As a result, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a landmark resolution that involved governments from around the world and created the Kimberley Process Certification Scheme (KPCS), effective in 2003. KPCS imposes strict requirements on members to certify shipments of rough diamonds as conflict-free. The process is incredibly extensive, but today there are 54 participants from more than 80 countries. Many believe that the implementation of the KPCS brought the issues to the forefront and inspired the movie. Either way, the issues came to

light and forever impacted the way we look at diamond mining, and by extension, the mining of other gemstones and precious metals.

It is this heightened awareness, combined with a concern for the health and wellbeing of the miners and the sustainability of our earth, that has made this a true hot-button topic. Today, consumers not only want to buy jewelry that is ethically sourced, but has also followed clear fair-mining practices, is sustainable, and maybe even has a social conscience. Luckily, many top brands are taking an active role in these efforts.

Gemfields, one of the world's largest mining companies for emeralds and rubies, is at the forefront of sustainable mining, with practices implemented at its Mozambique ruby mines and its Kagem emerald mines in Zambia. The company has established benchmark standards for emerald grading and is committed to environmental

replenishing of the area, and to ethical and transparent mining. Additionally, corporate social responsibility is of key importance to Gemfields, which works with local organizations in its mining areas to help build schools, bring in teachers, books and equipment, and build hospitals. It is also working with local farmers to help implement sustainable farming and is investing in reforestation. A host of jewelry houses and designers turn to Gemfields rubies and emeralds for this very reason.

Chopard is a leader, having developed a project in 2013 called The Journey to Sustainable Luxury, and was the first large-scale jewelry producer to sign a multi-year commitment to use sustainable, ethically sourced "Fairmined" gold for some of its creations. Fairmined gold holds a certification that the gold is responsibly gathered by small mining communities in South America where the miners are protected and the environment is replenished. Additionally, last year Chopard infused its Green Carpet Collection of High Jewelry with responsibly-mined Zambian emeralds

from Gemfields' Kagem mine.

Another initiative is Diamonds Do Good, started by the global non-profit Diamond Empowerment Fund (DEF). DEF was founded seven years ago by Russell Simmons and Dr Benjamin Chavis to tell the good stories about diamonds, and the benefits a country and its people receive through mining its natural resources. DEF is dedicated to empowering people in diamond communities. It supports education, skill-building and vocational training. Inspired by the many good programs their supporters champion in communities around the world, DEF started the Diamonds Do Good campaign and initiative to highlight these programs. Supporters include Forevermark (part of the DeBeers Group), Hearts On Fire (part of Chow Tai Fook) and CanadaMark (through Dominion Diamond). In fact, Dominion Diamond Corporation works in partnership with Aboriginal communities near the Ekati diamond mine in Canada to protect sub-Arctic wildlife. While the mining industry brought jobs and economic opportunities to the people, conserving nature was a priority.

All of these efforts showcase the fact that sustainable, ethical mining and jewelry making is possible. We just need to continue to be vigilant.

Olivier Krug on protecting his family's legacy

For six generations, the Krug family has delivered some of the world's finest champagnes, following the philosophy of founder Joseph Krug. As they uncork another year of excellence, Olivier Krug delves into his family's incredible history




Joseph Krug was a visionary man who understood that the essence of champagne was pleasure itself Growing up, it was never a given that I would follow in the footsteps of the five generations that have come before me at the House of Krug. But today, it is my great honor to be director of the house founded by my great-great-great grandfather Joseph Krug. He was a visionary man who understood that the essence of champagne was pleasure itself. Driven by a dream to offer the very best champagne every year, regardless of annual variations in climate, his pioneering idea went beyond all known boundaries to offer the fullest expression of champagne. By doing so, he created the sole champagne house to create only prestige champagnes every year since its founding. In 1848, my ancestor consigned the founding principles of the house to posterity in his dark cherry colored notebook and each generation has helped to move the house forward through their passion and dedication, while always staying true to its uncompromising philosophy of champagne creation.

When Joseph Krug passed away in 1866, his son Paul took over as head of the house. It was he who moved the house to its current location and built the premises and cellars we see today. In addition to expanding the business, he was father to 10 children, one of whom, Joseph II, succeeded him. I cannot talk about this poet and man of wit without talking about his wife, Jeanne, who kept the house going through the tribulations of the First World War, when her husband was taken prisoner. Jeanne is my personal hero; she offered the city's inhabitants shelter from heavy bombardment in Krug's cellars and carried out important volunteer work, while also succeeding in creating a 1915 vintage despite many vineyards being on the front line. Her son, Paul II, brought the house well and truly into the 20th century, putting advances in modern

technology at the service of Krug's craftsmanship. He introduced the use of small steel vats to preserve the incredible freshness of the house's reserve wines - a method we use to this day. He was succeeded by his sons Henri and Rémy, under whose forward-looking auspices the house acquired the Clos du Mesnil and Clos d'Ambonnay, now legendary thanks to their unique champagnes, each one the story of a single year and a single grape variety in a single plot of vines. In the 1970s, their desire to create a champagne that did not yet exist spurred the creation of Krug Rosé, an unexpected rosé champagne combining distinction and boldness.

When I joined the house in September 1989, I was fortunate enough to learn from two previous generations - my father, my uncle and my grandfather. In the tradition of the house, I was soon sent out into the world to meet and understand our clients. I spent 15 incredible years in Japan, during which time the country would become one of the house's top markets. I continue to travel a great deal in my current role, sharing the Krug spirit with Krug lovers. It is said that you never forget your first taste of Krug and the house shares a privileged relationship with these passionate and creative free spirits. I have the good fortune of visiting our network of Krug Ambassades all over the world. They are the setting for memorable sensory encounters, and for enjoying the unexpected yet exquisite pairing of Krug Grande Cuvée with some truly remarkable dishes.

When I am not traveling, I am in my beloved hometown of Reims. It is a beautiful city that I encourage you to visit. I live next door to the Krug family house, the fully restored historic residence of the Krug family and the place where I grew up. Today it offers a timelessly elegant space for Krug to

Every year these are tasted and assessed by the house's tasting committee before the cellar master Eric Lebel, guided by his great intuition and talent, chooses that year's champagnes.

Today Eric and the wine-making team perpetuate the house's extraordinary heritage of craftsmanship. My ancestor's unique philosophy lives on in Krug Grande Cuvée, the fullest expression of champagne, recreated every year from a blend of over 120 different wines from more than 10 different years. This April, Eric and his team finished the blend for Krug Grande Cuvée 172ème Édition, the 172nd edition of the dream of the house's founder that will leave Krug's cellars after a stay of at least seven years, gaining in expression and finesse. Every year since the foundation of the house, one creation, one blend, one bottling and thus one new Édition of Krug Grande Cuvée, the

fullest expression of champagne, has come to life. Now the number of each Édition is displayed on the bottle's front label, bringing to light the rarity, uniqueness and collectability of Krug Grande Cuvée.

Right now, I am particularly excited about the much-anticipated presentation of Krug 2004. After 12 years in the cellars, the story of the year 2004 captured by Krug is ready to be enjoyed. Named Luminous Freshness by the house, every time I taste this balanced and vibrant champagne, I am enveloped by the sensations of early summer mornings in the Champagne region. It will be presented alongside Krug Grande Cuvée 160ème Édition, composed around harvest of 2004, a blend of 121 wines from 12 different years. These two different expressions of nature, both of the same level of distinction, perfectly embody the approach my ancestor envisioned - one that all Krug champagnes follow to this day.

The unique story of each bottle of Krug 2004 will be revealed via its Krug ID, the six-digit number on the back label of every bottle of Krug champagne. Simply entering the Krug ID online at Krug.com, on the Krug app, on Google or Twitter opens the doors to an array of information, including the story of its creation, its composition, serving and storing tips and food and music pairing suggestions. As a house with a contemporary spirit and a history of pioneering, Krug embraces new digital technology and its potential to delight and strengthen our connection with Krug lovers.

It was in this spirit that the house created the Krug music pairings. For me, the joy of savoring a masterfully crafted champagne while listening to a piece of music allows one to travel down a direct pathway to emotion, and I am very glad that everyone can now share this experience. Each year, the house invites musicians in whose standards of excellence it feels a kinship to an extended tasting of its different champagnes. Inspired by what they taste, these artists choose a special playlist to reflect what they felt and how they connected to their tasting experience. These selections take the whole tasting experience to another dimension. I will leave you to discover the specially chosen music pairing for Krug 2004 as well as the house's other champagnes via the Krug app.

Jean-Christophe Babin on leading a diverse company


Heading up one of the world's foremost luxury brands is no easy task, especially when that brand's portfolio spans five different product categories, including hotels. However, Roberta Naas finds that Jean-Christophe Babin, CEO of Bulgari, has risen to the challenge, and is steering the company on a course of incredible growth and creativity.

Four years ago, when CEO Jean-Christophe Babin took the helm of Bulgari, he left behind the familiarity of 12 years spent as head of TAG Heuer to dive headlong into a journey that would encompass ultra-luxury watches, jewelry, fragrances, accessories and even exclusive hotels. Determined and ambitious, Babin began his course as CEO of LVMH-owned Bulgari by immersing himself in its vastly different, yet synergistically similar, worlds.

Starting with jewelry, Babin spent months learning and understanding the complexity of the Roman brand's amazing Italian jewelry roots. He studied its history, values, craftsmanship and clientele to ensure he could propel this key pillar to new heights.

"Bulgari was born as a jeweler, so my first attention was to make sure this backbone is strong and fortified, and that it is poised to grow in prestige and admiration," said Babin during a chat in a lush courtyard in Venice where the brand had just unveiled one of the largest collections of one-of-a-kind jewelry pieces ever. "This backbone impacts all of the other categories, so jewelry was, and still is, a huge priority. My goal is to make Bulgari the quintessence of dreams and desires through each of its different categories. I tell my team all the time, 'creativity is key' - there are no limits to what we can imagine next."

In fact, Babin says that when the design team presents him with an outrageous sketch or concept, he does not think about how or if it can be done. Instead he looks at it from a different perspective: "You must have a wide-open mind to all ideas, because only in that way can you grow," says Babin, who was exposed to many cultures and forms of art through travel in his early years. He backpacked the world after college before getting his first true job, and



says that experience enlightened him, making him more receptive.

Full of energy and enthusiasm, 58-year-old Babin refers to the *haute joaillerie* collections that brought us to Venice of as an example of that growth. One facet of the new collection celebrates the 160th birthday of Bulgari founder Sotirio Bulgari, and pays tribute to big, colorful, exquisite stones set in geometric and nature-inspired settings for which the brand is known. The other facet is the Festa collection that pays tribute to the festivals of Venice and Rome, to the princesses who hosted amazing balls and celebrations of harvest, and to moments of joy.

"When my design team came to me with the idea of setting a 15-carat D flawless diamond as the center stone of a ring and surrounding it with upsidedown diamonds, it was an incredible concept. It is a surprise that you don't expect, and that is what Bulgari stands for. The same is true of the necklace made of dozens of gemstones cut in the shape of pepperoncini, or the necklace that celebrates balloons," says Babin. "I encouraged the team to open the box in [terms of] creativity; I set no limits. Jewelry is art and passion, and I wanted them to think from the heart. They did that." Babin notes that as a result of this search for creativity, the brand actually developed an all-new oval-shaped cabochon cut for gemstones.

In addition to propelling the jewelry designs to new heights, Babin has also focused on building an all-new workshop in Valenza, Italy. Opened in January of this year, the expansive workshops are comprised of more than 150,000 sq ft in two spaces – one, an historic landmark building, the other, a glass-enclosed modern and sustainable building. Here, the maison will create all of its jewelry collections (except for the high jewelry which will remain in Rome), including B.Zero1, Serpenti, Diva, Bulgari-Bulgari and Parentesi. Currently it has 400 employees and the goal is to expand to 700 by the year 2020, according to Babin. Additionally, to train a new breed of jewelry makers, Manifattura Bulgari houses the newly formed Bulgari Jewelry Academy, a school dedicated to training students in the fine art of Bulgari's top Italian craft.

Bulgari, however, does not thrive on jewelry alone, and Babin is in charge of all categories. "It is very exciting to lead five different companies that, if they were separate would not be so strong, but together as a whole, are incredibly strong," he says. "We all have the same mission of cementing the brand and glorifying further Bulgari's capabilities."

Admitting he is very demanding, which he says is tempered by his easy accessibility and willingness to be contradicted, Babin compares himself to the conductor of an orchestra when it comes to leading the five divisions on a cohesive journey.

"My mission is to align the strategy, the integrity and to frame the evolution of the work for my general managers," says Babin. "I have only the best and most experienced in each of their markets. It is their mission to expand under my direction, to make Bulgari the most desirable luxury brand in the world. I determine the cadence of the music, the tone, I conduct the message and give it the tempo, but I don't play the music. I conduct it so that the more we move on, the more extraordinary the music is, even though it is not new music, it is a new interpretation."

As the conductor of that orchestra, Babin seems to be right on target. In watches, he has led the LVMH-owned brand on a path to developing world-first *haute horlogerie* complicated timepieces, as well as exceptional *haute joaillerie* watches that underscore the brand's impeccable jewelry roots. He has also grown the fragrance division and accessories, as well.

However, it is in the world of Bulgari Hotels & Resorts that Babin has perhaps learned the most. "The hotels are strictly service oriented, and we are required to create the ultimate services and **Bulgari** High Jewelry necklace in platinum with 59.11-carat Colombia cabochon emerald, 15.29 carats emeralds and 42.25 carat diamonds

experiences that aficionados of Bulgari expect," he explains.

Bulgari made its first foray into the world of boutique hotels just over a decade ago when it opened its first in Milan in 2004. It then opened Bali, followed by London in 2012. Now, under Babin's leadership, this year ushers in openings in Shanghai, Beijing and Dubai. Moscow is planned for 2019. "We want to have the most exclusive network of hotels in the 10 most attractive cities in the world," says Babin. "There is nothing more demanding than pleasing a customer in the hospitality field. With Bulgari, he or she can spend \$3,000 on a single night, which is the cost of a B-Zero1 ring. So in one case you have a night for \$3,000, or in the other case, you have something that will last a lifetime. When you check out, that money is gone, so the memory you have from your stay there has to be as memorable as the B-Zero1. It is about quintessential service. Even more important, though, is that understanding how to deliver the best possible service in the hotels can also translate to retail boutiques, so that they can offer exceptional service as well."

Along with offering superb service, Bulgari is expanding its boutiques. The store in New York has been under renovation since last March and is slated to open its doors this fall. Peter Marino is designing it and incorporating many features found at the brand's flagship Rome store on Via Condotti.

With so much happening around the globe, French-born Babin travels the world constantly to keep up with the events and schedules of all of the categories, as well as the brand's global soirees. He resides in Switzerland, where the brand's watches are produced, and splits his time between there and Italy, where the Roman headquarters are located, and the jewelry, fragrances and silk are made. "In a single day I can move from watches to manufacturing to hotel openings and more - all within the Bulgari framework. I love it," says Babin. "We have the ability to trigger dreams, to surprise the customers, whether it is with color, vibrant products or a night to remember. Other companies may not be able to deliver this, but we can, and we must do so brilliantly."

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

Deftly blending technology and craftsmanship, Vacheron Constantin's all-new Copernicus Celestial Spheres collection pays tribute to Nicolaus Copernicus and the great astronomical discovery, the theory of heliocentrism. This new collection is offered in three different dial versions and houses an original patent-pending caliber featuring peripheral hands. It reproduces the theory of heliocentrism with Earth's rotation during its yearly orbit around the sun (365.2423 days) and Earth's rotation on itself (24 hours). Incredibly precise, the "Earth" in this watch only needs to be adjusted every 8,000 years. This 18K white gold version features a hand-painted dial under layers of laser- and hand-engraved sapphire crystal.



This grand complication wristwatch pays tribute to the fact that the brand's founder, Abraham-Louis Breguet, was appointed the official horologer to the French Royal Navy by King Louis XVIII in 1814. Crafted in 18K white gold, the triple-complication timepiece features a tourbillon, perpetual calendar and offers a running equation of time to show the difference between average and real solar time. The running equation of time is displayed via a central hand on the main dial. That main dial is a study in elegance, with a center blue wave pattern and concentric outer rings for indication of the date and time. The bridges of the movement are engraved with a French navy vessel, and the case back allows for viewing of the movement. This high-complication watch offers 80 hours of power reserve.

Calendars

One of the more useful functions on wristwatches today is the calendar, which keeps track of the day, date, month and more, depending on the type of calendar movement. These watches are also classic and quite beautiful in looks, especially if they feature a moonphase indication. There are three types of calendar watches: complete calendars that need to be adjusted in months that are not 31 days; annual calendars that need to be adjusted in the short month of February; and perpetual calendars. The more complicated perpetual calendar tracks and automatically changes the date at the end of each month — taking into account the varying lengths. In short, its complex mechanics recognize whether a month has 28, 30 or 31 days. It even tracks leap years. Perpetual calendars generally do not need a single adjustment until the year 2100, when the leap year that should happen will not occur in order to keep consistent with the Gregorian calendar.

More than 100 years ago, the hand-held stopwatch was the only method of timing horses in races, or other intervals of time. Then watchmakers found ingenious ways to build the stopwatch into a pocketwatch and then a wristwatch. Today, chronograph watches - timepieces that measure continuous or discontinuous intervals of time - are among the most beloved on the market. One of the most alluring factors about a chronograph is its look: these watches typically have multiple subdials on the main dial, and are often boldly accented with color to offer an energetic appeal. A basic chronograph has an independent sweep seconds hand and typically hour counters (or totalizers) and minute counters. The amount of time a chronograph can track varies depending on the watch. There are several different types of chronographs, and many offer added functions such as altimeters for measuring altitude, tachymeters for measuring speed, and even pulsometers to measure, yes, the number of heartbeats per minute.

Complicated Horology

When things get complicated in a timepiece, it is a good thing. In fact, complicated watches are the benchmark of high horology, and top watch brands continually set new standards of excellence in this field. A complication is defined as a function other than time-telling that is added to a watch. Sometimes the added function is regarded as a small complication, such as GMT and world timers. Other times, the complication is more complex, such as a minute repeater or chiming watch, or an automaton. Additionally, there are grand complications, wherein multiple functions come together in a single watch. Long considered a complication because it aids in precision, the tourbillon (an escapement that compensates for errors in timekeeping due to the effects of gravity on the wrist) has come under scrutiny by some watch pundits today, who argue that the tourbillon does not bring an added "function" to the watch and so should not be in the complicated category. However, the constantly moving, mesmerizing escapement helps to improve precision and has been honed to such degrees that many brands offer multiple escapements in one watch, and multiple axes within a single

escapement. For this reason, we include the tourbillon in our complicated picks.

Perhaps no other timepiece in the world makes such a glimmering statement as a highjeweled watch. These masterpieces are true objects of art that offer breathtaking beauty and value for generations to come. It should be noted that these high-jeweled watches are not easy to create. In some instances, watch brands have developed special stone settings that enable the diamonds and gemstones to shimmer in new and different ways. Additionally, it can take hundreds of hours for a master artisan to prepare the watch — gently working the metal into the proper shapes — for gem setting. It then takes a master gem setter a few hundred more hours to individually set each stone with such precision that when the finger runs across the jewel, there is no gap, no uneven edge, only smoothness. Often, the most elaborately set pieces take months to complete.

Innovations

Sometimes a watch is born that surprises us with its unusual features that just don't seem to fit a single category. For instance, sometimes the watch performs a function that is intriguing, but not necessarily a complication. Other times, the watch company has delved so deeply into new technology or new materials that the innovation warrants strong attention. Here, we take a look at some of the more futuristic watches on the market this year, many of which are world-firsts.

MB&F HM6 ALIEN NATION

One of the newest creations from MB&F — easily one of the most innovative brands on the market — is the Horological Machine No 6 (HM6) Alien Nation. The HM6 Alien Nation is a series of four unique watches that are space-inspired. Marking a world-first for aliens in a watch, each timepiece actually features six extra-terrestrials carved in 18K gold by artisan Olivier Kuhn. In addition to the five placed around the movement that are visible through the entirely transparent sapphire case, the sixth alien is the pilot and he can be seen manning the bridge atop the movement. Adding cosmic glow to complete the theme, each of the four watches is finished with a mixture of Super-LumiNova and AGT Ultra by Black Badger, and glow in the dark in one of four colors: blue, green, turquoise, purple.

Art on the Wrist

One undeniably beautiful aspect in watchmaking today is the concept of Métiers d'Arts, as watch brands continue to pull out all the stops when it comes to creative dial designs and the use of art in horology. Where a Métiers d'Arts dial of yesteryear focused on stunning hand-painted or enamel dials, today we have all of that and more. In addition to fine painting and enamel work, today's highhorology brands are unveiling watches with dials featuring sculpted gold, fine embroidery, marquetry of stones, wood, mosaics and even feathers. Indeed, the only limit on creativity in the Métiers d'Arts field is the artisan's self-imposed constraints, if he or she has any. Often these dials are created using microscopes and tiny single-hair brushes or other minuscule tools of the trade. It can take hundreds of hours to complete a single dial.

VAN CLEEF & ARPELS LADY ARPELS PAPILLON AUTOMATE

This year, Van Cleef & Arpels pulled out all the stops with its Lady Arpels Papillon Automate 40mm Poetic Complication watch that combines automatons and several types of Métiers d'Arts. The watch dial is a stunning array of diamonds, multicolored sapphires, mother-of-pearl, miniature painting and champlevé, paillonné, plique-à-jour and curved plique-à-jour enamel that all come together to form a butterfly amidst a breathtaking garden. Because of their beauty and the way they enable almost transparent clarity, skeleton watches are incredibly coveted. 



GUIDE TO ST PETERSBURG



Peter the Great was so enamored with the elegance of European cities and Venice's graceful waterways that, by sheer force of will, he transformed a marshland into one of the most beautiful cities on earth. In doing so, he did more than create a city that would be the imperial capital for 200 years and serve as the cultural center of Russia; he introduced Russia to the western world and opened it to the modern era. In his quest, he succeeded in designing what Unesco calls "the greatest urban creation of the 18th century" (the historic center is a Unesco World Heritage site). In the so-called Venice of the North, colorful baroque and neoclassical buildings lie in perfect harmony among 42 islands, nearly 400 bridges, numerous canals and the Neva River. The low-rise architecture allows landmark buildings such as St Isaac's Cathedral to soar above the imperial palaces, dramatically punctuating the skyline.

The spirit of Peter and the city's painful past — most notably the revolution of 1917 and the 900-day siege during World War II — are heavy presences throughout St Petersburg, and everywhere you turn there is something to learn. It's best to hire

a guide to navigate the city and fully understand its history, as well as to help you avoid "Soviet service." You might think that Russians would be closed to visitors in the current political climate, but on the contrary, you'll find warm and welcoming people, eager to speak with you and tell you about their lives, and even the lives of their parents and grandparents who experienced some of the 20th century's most significant events. While the White Nights of the summer might emit a siren call to visitors, it's best to avoid high season and go in late spring or early fall when the weather is still nice but the city isn't overrun. As Russia continues to push forward — see the controversial Lakhta Center, with what will be Europe's tallest building being constructed in the north-west of the city — we can only hope St Petersburg retains its magic and is protected for future generations to enjoy.

CULTURAL COLLECTION

Orthodox cathedrals

There's no shortage of magnificent cathedrals in the city. Of course there's the famous St Isaac's Cathedral, which cuts an imposing figure in the city's skyline, offers superb city views from its colonnade, and inside boasts nearly every type of decorative art, including columns covered in malachite and lapis lazuli. But don't just stop there. The Cathedrals of Saints Peter and Paul, burial place of many members of the imperial family, date back to the city's founding in the early 1700s and its iconic needle spire can be seen throughout much of the city. Church of the Resurrection of Christ is a superb example of traditional Russian-style churches, with an elaborate facade, more than 80,000 sq ft of colorful mosaics and iconic onion domes. And beautiful Smolny Cathedral could appear atop a wedding cake with its pale blue-and-white walls and delicate domes.

Bridges at night

Every night at 1:30am, the bridges on the Neva River open to allow large ships to pass, effectively cutting off the two sides of the city. Before the construction of the ring road around the city, you had to closely watch the clock to be sure you didn't get stuck on the wrong side of the river. Stay up late one night to see the bridges in action. As it's one of the city's most well-loved activities, the riverbanks are thronged with people, so it's best to have your driver pull over for a quick photo or to enjoy an evening cruise and see the bridges open from the water.

Mariinsky Theatre

The Mariinsky Theatre has been an epicenter for Russian opera and ballet for more than two centuries, and launched the careers of many world-renowned dancers including Anna Pavlova and Mikhail Baryshnikov. Now in its 234th season, the theater shows both opera and ballet

performances, including Giselle and Swan Lake. Hotel Astoria has a close relationship with the theater and can arrange private behind-the-scenes tours before a performance, allowing you to walk across the raked stage, which slopes upwards to allow a view for the audience. As for the performance? The best seat in the house is the Tsar's Box. Be sure to enjoy a glass of champagne and caviar on toast during the intermission for a fully Russian experience. mariinsky.ru

The Museum of the **Imperial Porcelain Factory**

The museum boasts a collection of more than 4,000 pieces of porcelain, including important imperial tea sets, dinner services, sculptures and vases. You can also tour the inner workings of the factory and see firsthand how its masterpieces are made. Unless you are an artist yourself, skip the decorating class and visit

the gift shop instead — it's the best place to purchase porcelain in the city.

Nevsky Prospekt The boulevard runs through the historic center of the city, and strolling along it offers a lovely view into city life. Wander through shops and high-end boutiques, admire the facade of Kazan Cathedral, and when you've had enough, enjoy lunch or tea at Cafe Singer, located on the second floor of the Singer Building (now the Dom Knigi book store), and watch the city pass you by.

Rivers and canals

See the city as Peter the Great intended — from the water. Initially, he forbade nobility from traveling by land and going by boat was the only way to get around. Spend a leisurely afternoon slowly cruising through the city on a small boat and enjoy the unique vantage point. Have your concierge book a classic speedboat and pack some champagne for a truly magical trip.





TAKE THREE/// MUSEUMS

1. THE WINTER PALACE

Part of the State Hermitage Museum, the Winter Palace was the imperial home for nearly 200 years, beginning with Catherine the Great. With more than 120 rooms and three million objects, it's one of the largest museums in the world. The State Rooms are staggering in their opulence and grandeur, with baroque and rococo architecture, gilt throughout, ornate decorations and moldings, frescoes and fine materials, including malachite columns, incredible mosaics and enormous chandeliers. Other highlights include the dramatic Jordan staircase, treasure gallery, peacock clock, Kolyvan Vase — carved from a single 19.2 ton piece of jasper — and works from Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo and Raphael. Also inside Palace Square are the General Staff Building and the Great Hermitage, which house temporary exhibitions and Italian Renaissance. 19th and 20th-century European art. During regular opening hours, especially during the White Nights, the Winter Palace is absolutely jam-packed, so have your guide arrange for early admission or a visit after hours to enjoy the palace in relative peace hermitagemuseum.org

2. PETERHOF

Dubbed 'Russian Versailles,' after which Peter the Great modeled his amazing summer palaces Peterhof is an incredible complex with extensive grounds, several palaces, cathedrals and the world-famous Grand Cascade fountains. Much of the estate was razed by German troops during World War II, but has been meticulously rebuilt and restored. Take a hydrofoil from the city center to enjoy views of from the water before wandering through the gardens and admiring the astonishingly ornate imperial palaces. peterhofmuseum.ru

3. FABERGÉ

Find the world's largest collection of Fabergé objects, including nine of the famous Easter eggs, at Shuvalov Palace, a spectacular space in its own right. The collection unfolds through a series of grand rooms and showcases all of its métiers d'art, including figurines, special objects, dining sets, jewelry and clocks. Be sure to book a private guided tour with one of the on-staff experts to hear about the many secrets of the pieces and the incredible design techniques of Carl Fabergé. fabergemuseum.ru


HOTEL ASTORIA

WHERE TO DINE

ASTORIA CAFE

While Russian food isn't in vogue in the city, it's certainly an experience that every visitor should add to their schedule. Head to Astoria Cafe, where Chef Serge Fery presents traditional Russian cuisine in a modern way, while retaining its roots and culture. Start off with a caviar tasting paired either the French way with champagne or the Russian way with vodka, then move on to Olivier salad (a salad with king crab, vegetables, avocado and mayonnaise), Siberian pelmeni (small meat-filled dumplings served with sour cream), the best beef Stroganoff in the city, and finish with a slice of decadent *medovik*, a muti-layered honey cake. +7 812 494 5815

Sit in the tea room and work for an afternoon, dine in the restaurant, have the chef teach you a cooking class at the large open kitchen or take a selfie in the ginormous bath tub. It's open 24/7, 365 days a year.







The 1880s mining town has transformed into a sophisticated mini-metropolis, swank ski resort and chic year-round destination. In winter, you can ski from atop an 11,775ft summit on a black-diamond ski run; in warmer weather, you can hike, bike or do sun salutations atop the peak. After dark, savor fine food, including freshly-flown-in seafood, sip world-class wines, attend ballet, concert and jazz performances or simply hang out at a local pub. Culture gives a splendid sense of place to this environmentally caring, intellectually curious and ever-active community. Since 1899, when Jerome Wheeler launched a grand hotel and opera house, there's been a vibrant cultural ambiance; in the mid-20th century, it expanded to a core value when Elizabeth and Walter Paepcke founded the "Aspen idea" dedicated to the mind, body and spirit and inaugurated the Aspen Institute.

2. WOODY CREEK DISTILLERY

Spend an afternoon at Woody Creek Distillery, which makes craft spirits including rye whiskey, bourbon, gin from their own junipers and potato vodka from various farms in the nearby Roaring Fork Valley.

3. SUMMERTIME FESTIVALS

Reserve summertime tickets for lectures at the Aspen Institute's Aspen Ideas Festival or for absorbing performances by the Aspen Music Festival And School, the Aspen Opera Theater Center, Aspen Santa Fe Ballet company, Aspen Theater and Jazz Aspen Snowmass.

4. HISTORIC VENUES

And there are scenic hiking trails, too, including a two-hour hike to Crater Lake.






The art of caviar






Clockwise from top: *Living Cells* takes the Weaire-Phelan structure as inspiration; it's assembled by hand; the artist Paul Coudamy


